

# LPV321 Single/LPV358 Dual/LPV324 Quad General Purpose, Low Voltage, Low Power, Rail-to-Rail Output Operational Amplifiers

### **General Description**

The LPV321/358/324 are low power (9 $\mu$ A per channel at 5.0V) versions of the LMV321/358/324 op amps. This is another addition to the LMV321/358/324 family of commodity op amps.

The LPV321/358/324 are the most cost effective solutions for the applications where low voltage, low power operation, space saving and low price are needed. The LPV321/358/324 have rail-to-rail output swing capability and the input common-mode voltage range includes ground. They all exhibit excellent speed-power ratio, achieving 15 KHz of bandwidth with a supply current of only 9 $\mu$ A.

The LPV321 is available in space saving SC70-5, which is approximately half the size of SOT23-5. The small package saves space on PC boards, and enables the design of small portable electronic devices. It also allows the designer to place the device closer to the signal source to reduce noise pickup and increase signal integrity.

The chips are built with National's advanced submicron silicon-gate BiCMOS process. The LPV321/358/324 have bipolar input and output stages for improved noise performance and higher output current drive.




Sourcing Current vs. Output Voltage












Sourcing Current vs. Output Voltage




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


### Non-Inverting Large Signal Pulse Response




### Inverting Large Signal Pulse Response




### Stability vs. Capacitive Load







### Inverting Small Signal Pulse Response







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# **Application Information**

### 1.0 BENEFITS OF THE LPV321/358/324

### Size

The small footprints of the LPV321/358/324 packages save space on printed circuit boards, and enable the design of smaller electronic products, such as cellular phones, pagers, or other portable systems. The low profile of the LPV321/358/324 make them possible to use in PCMCIA type III cards.

### Signal Integrity

Signals can pick up noise between the signal source and the amplifier. By using a physically smaller amplifier package, the LPV321/358/324 can be placed closer to the signal source, reducing noise pickup and increasing signal integrity.

### Simplified Board Layout

These products help you to avoid using long pc traces in your pc board layout. This means that no additional components, such as capacitors and resistors, are needed to filter out the unwanted signals due to the interference between the long pc traces.

### Low Supply Current

These devices will help you to maximize battery life. They are ideal for battery powered systems.

### Low Supply Voltage

National provides guaranteed performance at 2.7V and 5V. These guarantees ensure operation throughout the battery lifetime.

### Rail-to-Rail Output

Rail-to-rail output swing provides maximum possible dynamic range at the output. This is particularly important when operating on low supply voltages.


### Input Includes Ground

Allows direct sensing near GND in single supply operation.

The differential input voltage may be larger than V  $^+$  without damaging the device. Protection should be provided to prevent the input voltages from going negative more than -0.3V (at 25°C). An input clamp diode with a resistor to the IC input terminal can be used.


### 2.0 CAPACITIVE LOAD TOLERANCE

The LPV321/358/324 can directly drive 200pF in unity-gain without oscillation. The unity-gain follower is the most sensitive configuration to capacitive loading. Direct capacitive loading reduces the phase margin of amplifiers. The combination of the amplifier's output impedance and the capacitive load induces phase lag. This results in either an underdamped pulse response or oscillation. To drive a heavier capacitive load, circuit in *Figure 1* can be used.



### FIGURE 1. Indirectly Driving A Capacitive Load Using Resistive Isolation


In *Figure 1*, the isolation resistor R<sub>ISO</sub> and the load capacitor C<sub>L</sub> form a pole to increase stability by adding more phase margin to the overall system. The desired performance depends on the value of R<sub>ISO</sub>. The bigger the R<sub>ISO</sub> resistor value, the more stable V<sub>OUT</sub> will be. *Figure 2* is an output waveform of *Figure 1* using 100kΩ for R<sub>ISO</sub> and 1000pF for C<sub>L</sub>.

The circuit in *Figure 3* is an improvement to the one in *Figure 1* because it provides DC accuracy as well as AC stability. If there were a load resistor in *Figure 1*, the output would be voltage divided by  $R_{ISO}$  and the load resistor. Instead, in *Figure 3*,  $R_F$  provides the DC accuracy by using feed-forward techniques to connect  $V_{IN}$  to  $R_L$ . Caution is needed in choosing the value of  $R_F$  due to the input bias current of the LPV321/358/324. C <sub>F</sub> and  $R_{ISO}$  serve to counteract the loss of phase margin by feeding the high frequency component of the output signal back to the amplifier's inverting input, thereby preserving phase margin in the overall feedback loop. Increased capacitive drive is possible by increasing the value of C<sub>F</sub>. This in turn will slow down the pulse response.



### 3.0 INPUT BIAS CURRENT CANCELLATION




### FIGURE 4. Cancelling the Error Caused by Input Bias Current

The LPV321/358/324 family has a bipolar input stage. The typical input bias current of LPV321/358/324 is 1.5nA with 5V supply. Thus a 100k $\Omega$  input resistor will cause 0.15mV of error voltage. By balancing the resistor values at both inverting and non-inverting inputs, the error caused by the amplifier's input bias current will be reduced. The circuit in *Figure 4* shows how to cancel the error caused by input bias current.

### 4.0 TYPICAL SINGLE-SUPPLY APPLICATION CIRCUITS

### 4.1 Difference Amplifier

The difference amplifier allows the subtraction of two voltages or, as a special case, the cancellation of a signal common to two inputs. It is useful as a computational amplifier, in making a differential to single-ended conversion or in rejecting a common mode signal.




### **FIGURE 5. Difference Amplifier**

### 4.2 Instrumentation Circuits

The input impedance of the previous difference amplifier is set by the resistor  $R_1$ ,  $R_2$ ,  $R_3$ , and  $R_4$ . To eliminate the problems of low input impedance, one way is to use a voltage follower ahead of each input as shown in the following two instrumentation amplifiers.

### 4.2.1 Three-op-amp Instrumentation Amplifier


### FIGURE 6. Three-op-amp Instrumentation Amplifier

The quad LPV324 can be used to build a three-op-amp instrumentation amplifier as shown in *Figure 6*

The first stage of this instrumentation amplifier is a differential-input, differential-output amplifier, with two voltage followers. These two voltage followers assure that the input impedance is over 100M $\Omega$ . The gain of this instrumentation amplifier is set by the ratio of  $R_2/R_1$ .  $R_3$  should equal  $R_1$  and  $R_4$  equal  $R_2$ . Matching of  $R_3$  to  $R_1$  and  $R_4$  to  $R_2$  affects the CMRR. For good CMRR over temperature, low drift resistors should be used. Making  $R_4$  Slightly smaller than R $_2$  and adding a trim pot equal to twice the difference between R $_2$  and  $R_4$  will allow the CMRR to be adjusted for optimum.

# Application Information (Continued)

### 4.2.2 Two-op-amp Instrumentation Amplifier

A two-op-amp instrumentation amplifier can also be used to make a high-input-impedance DC differential amplifier (*Figure 7*). As in the three-op-amp circuit, this instrumentation amplifier requires precise resistor matching for good CMRR. R<sub>4</sub> should equal to R<sub>1</sub> and R<sub>3</sub> should equal R<sub>2</sub>.

### 4.3 Single-Supply Inverting Amplifier

There may be cases where the input signal going into the amplifier is negative. Because the amplifier is operating in single supply voltage, a voltage divider using R<sub>3</sub> and R<sub>4</sub> is implemented to bias the amplifier so the input signal is within the input common-common voltage range of the amplifier. The capacitor C<sub>1</sub> is placed between the inverting input and resistor R<sub>1</sub> to block the DC signal going into the AC signal source, V<sub>IN</sub>. The values of R<sub>1</sub> and C<sub>1</sub> affect the cutoff frequency, fc = 1/2 $\pi$  R<sub>1</sub>C<sub>1</sub>.

As a result, the output signal is centered around mid-supply (if the voltage divider provides  $V^+/2$  at the non-inverting input). The output can swing to both rails, maximizing the signal-to-noise ratio in a low voltage system.






FIGURE 8. Single-Supply Inverting Amplifier

### 5.0 ACTIVE FILTER


### Simple Low-Pass Active Filter




### FIGURE 10. Frequency Response of Simple Low-pass Active Filter in Figure 9

The simple low-pass filter is shown in *Figure 9.* Its low-frequency gain( $\omega \rightarrow o$ ) is defined by  $-R_3/R_1$ . This allows low-frequency gains other than unity to be obtained. The filter has a -20dB/decade roll-off after its corner frequency fc.  $R_2$  should be chosen equal to the parallel combination of  $R_1$  and  $R_3$  to minimize errors due to bais current. The frequency response of the filter is shown in *Figure 10* 





### FIGURE 9. Simple Low-Pass Active Filter

Note that the single-op-amp active filters are used in to the applications that require low quality factor, Q ( $\leq$  10), low frequency ( $\leq$  5KHz), and low gain ( $\leq$  10), or a small value for the product of gain times Q ( $\leq$  100). The op amp should have an open loop voltage gain at the highest frequency of interest at least 50 times larger than the gain of the filter at this frequency. In addition, the selected op amp should have a slew rate that meets the following requirement:

Slew Rate  $\geq$  0.5 x ( $\omega_H V_{OPP}$ ) X 10<sup>-6</sup>V/µsec

Where  $\omega_{H}$  is the highest frequency of interest, and  $V_{\mathsf{OPP}}$  is the output peak-to-peak voltage.
